## Sustainable Gardening

The City is hosting a series of free Smart Gardening Composting workshops during the summer months that will focus on water-wise gardening, drought tolerant plant selection and organic composting. Residents are invited to participate and learn about plant combinations that require less water and add more color to your garden. Compost bins will be available for purchase at this event at discounted prices. The price for the organic compost bin is \$45, and the price for the worm compost bin is \$65. The composting workshops will take place at the Diamond Bar Center Sycamore Room, located at 1600 Grand Avenue, during the following dates/times:

Residents may utilize the mobile, one-day collection event to properly dispose of HHW and electronic waste free of charge.

Examples of items you can bring to the event: computer monitors, televisions, printers, paint, paint thinner, brake fluid, motor oil, oil filters, expired pharmaceuticals, anti-freeze, and fluorescent light bulbs.
